The recognition confirms Tulane SoPA's information technology and cybersecurity curriculum and faculty meet National Security Agency (NSA) and Department of Defense standards for cybersecurity education. Validated programs undergo rigorous peer-review and evaluation by U.S. federal cybersecurity agencies.
